Federal Guidelines

United States	<p>There are no federal restrictions specifically affecting restaurants. However, the Trump Administration issued guidance calling on Americans to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> avoid gatherings of more than 10 people; avoid eating and drinking in bars, restaurants, and public food courts; encourage restaurants and patrons to use drive-thru, pickup, or delivery options.
